From East of Toronto take Hwy 401 West to Toronto to exit 412, Thickson Rd, Whitby. Turn right off of the exit ramp and follow Thickson Rd north to Baldwin St (Hwy 12) and turn right. Follow highway 12 for approximately 85 km at which point it will continue to the left. In Orillia turn left at Memorial Ave.

From West of Toronto take Hwy 401 East to Toronto to highway 400 north towards Barrie. Take highway 11 north towards Orillia. Take exit 129 to merge onto Memorial Ave (or county road 49).

From Sudbury take Hwy 69 south, which changes to Hwy 400. Take exit 141 for highway 12 toward Waverly/Coldwater. Turn left onto Hwy 12 (county road 23). Take the highway 11 south/highway 12 south ramp and merge. Take Oro-Medonte Line 15 exit and turn right on to Line 15 north which becomes Memorial Ave in Orillia.
